Notify Residents/ Families about COVID Cases	CMS requires nursing homes to inform residents, their representatives, and families of the occurrence of either a single confirmed infection of COVID-19, or three or more residents or staff with newonset of respiratory symptoms occurring within 72 hours of each other.	By 5 p.m. the next calendar day following the occurrence of a reportable event. Include any cumulative updates at least weekly or by 5 p.m. the next calendar day following the subsequent occurrence of a reportable event. Laboratory Reporting	If you conduct COVID-19 point-of-care antigen tests in your facility under a CLIA certificate of waiver, you are acting as a laboratory and must report results of those tests, both positive and negative, for each individual test subject. Either submit a spreadsheet through MDH Provider Portal or submit data using CDC's National Healthcare Safety Network (NSHN) Point-of-Care (POC) Test Reporting Tool. Notifications of Operation for Adult Day services providers during the Peacetime Emergency:

- Before providing services remotely or in the home or residence of people who receive services, providers must submit the <u>Notification of Operation of Alternative Adult</u>

 <u>Day Services form, DHS-7313 (PDF)</u> to notify the DHS Licensing Division of their intention to provide services during the peacetime emergency. Providers also must affirm that they will comply with the modified licensing standards. Reference: <u>Alternative adult day service delivery due to COVID-19 pandemic</u>.
- For those centers that intend to resume in-person operation, <u>review Modified Licensing Requirements For Adult Day Centers That Resume Facility Operation During The Peacetime Emergency</u>, and note that you will need to complete a <u>specific DHS form</u>.
