#### **PURPOSE:**

All settings/services licensed by the Minnesota Departments of Health or Human Services are required to report instances of maltreatment of residents including care centers, assisted living, hospice, adult day services, and home and community-based services. In addition, any federally certified skilled nursing facilities have additional federal reporting requirements. This workshop will be highly interactive and will take a maltreatment case from the initial report of potential maltreatment to staff through the interdisciplinary team review and care plan/individualized abuse prevention plan creation.

## **LEARNING OBJECTIVES:**

- Review maltreatment regulations and requirements.
- Develop/revise your maltreatment policy to cover education, reporting, and the investigation process.
- Examine what information needs to go into a maltreatment report, and when and how to make a report.
- Write a practice report during a sample report writing exercise.
- Describe the maltreatment investigation process.
- Apply the investigation process in small groups using a case study by conducting mock interviews, completing a timeline, root cause analysis, and finalizing a maltreatment report.
