Safe Care for Seniors: Our Calling. Our Commitment. Our Culture.

You will see a strengthened commitment from leadership to safe care, safety champions from throughout our organization, new opportunities for learning and training, a focused effort on improving communication with our residents and families and engaging them in our safety and quality work, and creating a stronger safety culture that encourages speaking up, reporting and learning from mistakes.

This event will celebrate all we do today and renew our commitment to treating people with respect and dignity – always – and speaking up and doing all we can to prevent harm.
