The Award of Honor recognizes aging services providers that have achieved the Award of Merit and then implemented an even more mature level of excellence in their organizational operations. These recipients have been reviewed by trained evaluators and deemed as meeting established criteria, describing the systematic and effective processes they have in place for 24 different leadership and

management practices within six key categories: leadership, strategy, customers, measurement, workforce and operations.

Performance Excellence in Aging Services was created by LeadingAge Minnesota in 2017 to help aging services providers innovate and improve the services and supports they provide to older adults. The continuous learning and development program is centered on the values and criteria of the Baldrige Performance Excellence Program, which focuses on seven core areas of achievement and improvement:

- Leadership: How management leads the organization and how the organization leads the community
- Strategy: How the organization establishes and plans to implement strategic directions
- Customers: How the organization builds and maintains strong, lasting relationships with customers
- Measurement: How the organization uses data to support key processes and manage performance
- Workforce: How the organization empowers and involves its workforce
- Operations: How the organization designs, manages and improves key processes
- Results: How the organization performs in customer satisfaction, operational efficiencies, governance and social responsibility
